### **Art of Living Workshop**

As continuation of Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre (SSRRC) and part of our newly launched project of “Village Development Program” at Jaitpur, Greater Noida, UP we had a humble beginning with the following assignments on 17<sup>th</sup> August 2013.

1. Senior Citizen Care Program:-

- a. “Art of Living” workshop – Nav – Chetna shivir from 17<sup>th</sup> August – 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2014 for Elderly persons. Timing 06:15 am – 08:00 am.

To help individuals get rid of stress and experience inner peace, the Art of Living offers stress-elimination programs which include breathing techniques, meditation and yoga. Such a program was offered at Jaitpur on 17<sup>th</sup> August to help many lives around the village to overcome stress, depression and violent tendencies.

It started well with 17-20 villagers attending the program at 6:30 am with the promise to bring more families for the benefits which were visible to them.

- b. Next activity on our age"" is to organize a free eye checkup camp in September 2013 with free medicine distribution. We would be creating awareness in this regard before the actual event.

2. Teaching Assistance Program by SSRRC

The task of identifying schools in genuine need of assistance has been undertaken by Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre and some schools serving poor communities have been selected in the first phase. Some of these are state schools which do not have the required funds to provide more than the most basic facilities, while others will be private schools providing an English medium education. To begin with our endeavour to making a difference, we started with grade 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> of primary school of Jaitpur.

We first analyzed with the shortcomings and made a strategy. We realized that they need to be divided in three groups and there is a need of constant monitoring and evaluation. We started with imparting the basic knowledge of etiquettes simple basic information of writing and reading of their names, class, name of school and age correctly. "After school hours holding children with their full attention proved to be a herculean task but the



overall experience was more gratifying than expected”; informed our JRE college student volunteers. They deserve Kudos and need to come fully prepared next week as per discussion" said Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre Managing Director Dr. Sush Singh.

Winners of 15th August painting competition were awarded with their gifts. Tannu of class 5 was declared overall winner for using right colors for the National flag and for a sweet message.

### **Free Eye Checkup Camp**

Knowing the facts that there are a staggering 13 million blind people living in India, amongst these 2 million are children and every year 2.3 millions people develop cataract in their eyes, Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre in collaboration of Mahavir International, Delhi organized a free eye checkup camp in Jaitpur village, Gautam Budha Nagar, UP on 5<sup>th</sup> Sept, 2013 to mark the special occasion of Teachers day!. This was a continuation of the social initiative of Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre in Jaitpur to make a difference!

On this occasion we had an inauguration followed by a special message through Nukkar Natak by college students and village school children. For the benefit of Jaitpur and nearby villages a group of Eye specialists and Refractionists from Mahavir International counseled the participants on eye care by a comprehensive computerized eye examination. An expert team created a list of patients who were referred to free eye surgery for cataract in hospitals centre's for Mahavir International on next working day. As per today's working environment, of the ever-increasing expectations for efficiency and performance, good vision is critical to ensure the ability to produce good results so specialists informed the villagers about the importance of regular eye checkup and gave some tips on caring for and protecting their eyes. They also advised the participants about the cataract, glaucoma care to be taken. The camp witnessed sincere participation of over three hundred villagers.

With these small efforts we were able to not make them understand that a regular eye test is the best way to protect our eyesight--and an easy precaution to take--as many sight-threatening diseases can be cured or slowed if caught early enough, we were able to spread a few messages through our Nukkar Natak and one to one interaction.

The camp could not have been possible without the support of a large number of people as enthusiastic participants. First of all we are thankful to Village heads and senior citizens who ensured spreading of event date and purpose by beating of drums in and around the village.





The key contribution to the program was from the side of Mahavir International who not only arranged Doctors for the camp but also agreed to undertake the free surgery of people detected with diseases like cataract and Glaucoma. They were also kind enough to finance food packets and supported the local arrangements facilitated by Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre.

### **Launch of GCEAP-Girl Child Education Adoption Program**

We at Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre firmly believe that any corporation or educational institution has to involve and make social responsibility its organizational philosophy rather than merely a philanthropic exercise. Therefore, Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre established a GCEAP-"Girl Child Education Adoption Program" in Jaitpur.

In continuation of our efforts of promoting primary education and girl child education program we conducted our survey on 21st September 2013 of meeting families of needy children and evaluated standard of few schools available in the vicinity. To confirm with our first observation regarding private schools for GCEAP program we visited Muskaan Public School to check its standard of teaching especially in standard 2nd, 4th & 11th. A number of students from class 2nd were able to do the same worksheet which children of class 4th & 5 of village primary school could not even attempt. Class 11th students were motivated to empower themselves by showing willingness to learn English and computers through various described methods. Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre promised them to provide more guidelines and a computer with some English coaching classes in the future.

In order to forward the initiative of GCEAP program we enquired about the fee structure of Muskaan Public School and also assessed its standard of teaching as expected the teaching in school certainly better but the monthly fee was on higher side comparing to the financial status of village. In this regard we also interacted with father of Tannu a 10 year old girl child and learnt he is trying his level best to provide decent education to his four children but he is unable to do so, due to his poor salary structure. We would like to promote Tannu a bright child and a willing learner of class 4 of village school to go to a proper school to equip herself with quality education.

We had a question answer session with teams of boys and girls and the girls winning the show. We ended the day with two sports activities where boys were declared as winner. Children of village primary school kept on enquiring about student volunteer and requested me to get them next time. It was really disheartening to learn that children of this age are deprived of fun filled learning activities in their schools. Therefore, Sai Social



Responsibility & Research Centre is more determined to work with an aim to bring a change in traditional learning patterns in India.

### **Primary School Teaching Program**

This weekend, we successfully continued with our two projects at Jaitpur village. For the course assistantship classes for Primary school students from 12:00 Noon to 01:30 PM, Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre at Jaitpur village the first day there were 67 participants and more participants are expected in days to come. This Saturday the number increased to 88. By now, as we were able to understand the students ability, so the second project DIY( Do it Yourself) started with great enthusiasm where in the volunteers started the educational activity classes at primary school in Jaitpur village with basic English. The volunteers distributed chocolates and other eatables to boost up the Morales of the winners and participants students. The classes ended up by giving assignments for the next session.

The learning for our student volunteers was also immense as the values that come with teaching the disadvantaged and caring of their small needs are precious and unparalleled.

Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre has seen a dream of ensuring quality education and empowerment to the disadvantaged of Jaitpur Village and with a true coordination of thoughts and action we can certainly achieve it.

### **Launching of free computer classes at Jaitpur**

While Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre was making sincere efforts in making a difference in traditional learning pattern of village school Jaitpur, a student of inter college from Sadipur, adjacent to Jaitpur, Dadri, U.P, Sumit Kumar ( of Jaitpur village) wrote to us that we really appreciate for all the works that you and your team has done till now, however for students like us who have no access to computer education, employability will be tougher. As of now I'm in class11th and will be going to work after few years. But, I understand that without being technically sound it's hard to get a job.

Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre's Managing Director took up this challenge and formulated a simple plan to facilitate basic computer skills at village head premises with the help of enthusiastic student volunteers..

“By opening up computer education, we hope to facilitate mote learning, job and advancement opportunities to anyone who wants them,” said Dr. Sushi Singh, Managing Director- Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre.

Formal registration for the classes is expected to begin by this week and classes start on Oct. 11 and extend through December. Public school students and regular village school students, as well as the general public, will have access to the new computer learning tools.

Mr. Manoj Gupta, Ex Senior Executive from Wipro and a social activist motivated JRE and Village Youth to run the show for holistic development of village and encouraged them further by announcing a laptop for the coaching/training centre. This was applauded by the villagers. Gen. R. N. Tikku, senior advisor to JRE group of Institutions who graced the occasion was a real sport who offered cricket match on regular basis between JRE and Jaitpur youth to the students showing keen interest in learning computer classes and students cheered this idea. A few dictionaries were facilitated by Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre – Managing Director, Dr. Sushi and JRE president handed it over to the needy students of grade 12'h of a public school who wanted to share with all classmates who cannot afford the same. Student project leader, Komal shall circulate the basic teaching plan and registered list of student along with the list of student volunteers. Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre is determined to take this small yet effective initiative further. The team EF- Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre also visited to



village and revised the lesson of naming words with grade III, IV and V through activity method and churning out empathetic corporate leaders in the process as a byproduct.

Hasrate Hamari" which shall bein full swing at the beginning of next academic session 2014-15. we were able to finish the ground work and identify the felt needs in this regard at one end and on the other hand we were able to find a few willing contributors to join hands to fight this one of the biggest social evil across south asia.

We along with prospected donor able to visit Neha, a girl child home and meet her parents to understand the need of initiating GCEAP at our end. We were really thankful to Mr. Neeraj Arora and Mr. Tarun Kumar who selflessly come forward to join hands and support the cause. We rather return more determined to tackle these initial technical and regional small challenges and turn them into an opportunity. We shall be able to coordinate with all possible stakeholders and launch our GCEAP formally with our real contributors on occasion of 14<sup>th</sup> Nov, Children's Day-2013.

### **Diwali Celebration at Jaitpur Village**

Sometimes I wonder if everyone requires lots of money to enjoy and be happy. Can one smile genuinely and get excited to show his or her best even if one does not have enough food on any day? Can one still celebrate Diwali even if worse off than some others in the world? If these questions were asked to me before I had celebrated Diwali with the children at Jaitpur village, probably my reply would have been 'No'. But today the reply would be in the form of a question," Can anyone else celebrate Diwali in better way than they do?"

I am talking about the Diwali celebration at Jaitpur village. We go to the village for the 'outreach' program, a unique program to teach the children. Once my mother has said that these children require love and some happy moment's even more than formal teaching and I found it's very true.

It was October 31st and we all gathered in the village at around nine in the morning. All the children were then taken to the nearby Govt. Primary school; en route we could feel the excitement and enthusiasm among college volunteers and the school students. I can assure you that most of them might not have taken any breakfast. I am not even sure how many of them would have taken dinner the night before, but not a glimpse revealing hunger could be seen on their faces. After we reached our destination, we started our day with prayers.

After the prayer, snacks were distributed among the children and we blew up balloons and some students were preparing tracks for the various running competitions. Children were playing here and there among themselves, but they frequently wanted us to join them. These children enjoyed themselves so much since we were also with them. As the race started, everybody was applauding including me, but Babu was simply running toward me, as if he was running to reach me. He did not even bother about the race he simply ran and finally jumped on me. While he was running, he smiled and seemed so happy that I was encouraging him. I cannot express in words what I felt when he jumped on me. For one moment, I felt extremely happy and felt like crying, I do not know why!

After these games, we distributed food. Everyone was taking part in every whing and enjoying with children. The children liked our camera, so they posed as per their wish!





The children were very hungry and extremely delighted to see the food, but no one created any problem. They washed their hands properly, sat quietly and ate with full satisfaction. You should have seen them while they ate no one wasted even a little food. I think any amount of food earns maximum respect from these people. The people serving the food also felt satisfied as they respected the children for not wasting food.

After eating, it was time to have more fun. We had arranged lots of colours, diyas in a classroom and were allowed to paint and take it along them to decorate their houses, I felt as if they would never need any other item to play with and enjoy. Then a beautiful animated film, which included these children, was shown. The children were so excited to see their photos on screen and were carried away by the background music. After the film the children were asked to dance to some different music selections. I was so surprised to see their innovative steps. They were trying to imitate popular dance steps. Everybody was trying to show their best and others were encouraging them, but some were also feeling a little shy. There was no showing off but a sincere attempt to perform better. Though they were not perfect or very synchronized, I felt everything they were doing was so natural, that all appreciated their efforts. Next there was prize distribution, and then each child was given some crackers to burst. We blasted some crackers and the children were so excited to see the different types bursting. After this, it was afternoon, the celebration was over and it was time to take the children back to their homes. They all returned home with joy and some good moments.

The celebration might appear to be a very ordinary gathering to many, but I personally felt that the smiles that we could generate on innocent faces gave me a special satisfaction which I never had experienced before in my life. Similar was the feelings for college volunteers. After celebrating Diwali with them, I realized that anyone can find real happiness if we make the effort to smile and spread that smile to others. These children were not wanting anything materially. They were not hungry for food it's has been their habit to be hungry. What they needed was a little love and compassion, a love which is natural, which comes directly from heart, which never differentiates among any human beings. I strongly believe they could identify with that and they respected that the most.

I do not know how much I love these people, but I have no doubt in saying that next time I also would like to celebrate Diwali with them maybe then, and maybe always.

- A poster making competition with the theme of "Stop Aids" was also organized with the limited resources from Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre.
- A light refreshment was arranged by Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre's Managing Director through her own resources.





The whole program at the contribution of Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre is highly appreciated by the villagers though very few ladies come forward for the same and most of the village elderly people could not understand the concept very clearly. ### **Shristi – GCEAP Takes Off!!**

A formal function was organized at Jaitpur village to launch a new initiative of Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre “The Blue Window Initiative” which incorporated “Shristi”/ GCEAP and a step towards vocational training center (VTC). “Shristi” is a women centric program under which private/ corporate/ organizational donors motivated to participate and take up the responsibility of financial support of a girl child education for the whole year.

During the function held on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2014 to mark the glorious occasion of 65<sup>th</sup> Republic Day” three girl students from marginalized section of society were enrolled in private schools of Jatipur to motivate them to continue with their studies. Nargis (13 Yrs girl child of class II), Neha (11yrs old girl child) were admitted in Ram Rahim Memorial school while Tanu (12 Yrs old girl child) was given admission in Muskaan Public School depending on their location of homes and as per the consent and promise of their parents to make them regular.

Our donors were informed for this event and one named Mr. Neeraj Arora (Custodian of Neha) was present there to witness the program. The cheques were presented to the principals of the schools by Managing Director - Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre, Dr. Susha Singh. The principal were kind enough to understand the concept and give us the subsidies packages of the whole year learning, who also presented books and uniform for the year to these adopted children. This was a humble beginning by Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre which proposes to reach the target of 12 girl children this year (out of 600 school going children 40% are girls and 5% of them required immediate help).

The occasion was also marked by introducing students of TERI University (TATA Energy Research Institute) to the internship program under the banner of Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre’s. The students would conduct a research for starting a Vocational Training Center in the village Jaitpur while comparing the felt needs of five neighboring



villagers. The concept of the program and other aspects were beautifully outlined by Dr. Susha Singh in her speech. Students showed keen interest for taking off the project at the village while the ex-village head, present village head and all the women folk present over there assured them to cooperate.

At the end, team Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre along with the TERI student volunteers visited the home of ex-village head Mr. Om Prakash who promised to lend his land for event but the contentious has to be arrived as the two community who really visit each other areas has to agree to send their women folk to VTC therefore, the location, the land, the logistics of the VTC seems to be an important challenge which needs to be resolved besides the efforts have to be made for the arriving on this proposal. Ex-village head has agreed to take up the topic to the village council.

In the meantime, student volunteers of TERI have also made efforts in the village so that the psychological and social barriers are removed if not removed. This would be really a challenge for the students and everyone at the foundation.

Managing Director, Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre also paid a personal visit along with the others to the home of one adopted girl child on her request to convince her parents for sending the girl to school on regular basis. After little efforts the father of the child agreed (who was in agreement earlier but denied later) and the happiness was visible on the face of girl child named Nargis.

Sai Social Responsibility & Research Centre took this opportunity to acknowledge his goodwill ambassadors for this event. First of all we thank Mr. Trilok Agarwal who was kind enough to sponsor the food for the occasion which was highly appreciated by the village residents. The gifts for Chief Guest/ Village and the women leader of upcoming Vocational Training Center along with for women participants were donated by Mr. V.K Surekha of Mauria Udyog Limited. Presence of Mr. Neeraj Arora who was one of the Shristi's program donor was a true encouragement for the young minds and village residents.
